April is the Wisconsin 4-H Service Month and a great time to give back to your community! Below you will find a list of ideas for service projects and resource links, but these aren't the only possibilities. Take some time to reflect on your community, identify needs and plan a service project that will make a difference AND celebrate 100 years of 4-H in Wisconsin!

- 1. 100 letters challenge-write letters to soldiers letting them know you appreciate their service
- 2. Make Hero Packs for OMK: Operation Military kids to support Wisconsin military families
- 3. Collect, repair and donate used bikes to a community agency
- 4. Help elders in your communities mow, pull weeds, shovel snow, paint
- 5. Organize a food drive for a local food pantry. 100 cans (or 100 pounds) challenge
- 6. Read 100 books to children in a library program
- 7. Collect used magazines and take them to preschools for arts and crafts
- 8. Organize a community Arbor Day celebration-plant trees in public areas
- 9. 100 mile challenge-organize active wellness events such as bike rides or hikes
- 10. Bake 100 4-H cookies or cupcakes and give them to the local police, fire, and ambulance workers to say thank you for their service to the community
- 11. Create a Little Free Library (littlefreelibrary.org)

Signs need to be up by July at and taken down within one week after the fair. Signs must be placed on private land and not in the road right of way. Ask permission from the landowner. Email a colored photo to awebb@co.pierce.wi.us prior to the fair indicating locations and if new or reused. Signs MUST be down within a week!!

Summer Riding Program

Summer Riding Program (SRP) will start on Monday, May 19, 2014 for levels 1, 2, & 3 and Tuesday, May 20 for levels 4, 5, & 6. The SRP enrollment form can be found enclosed in this Informant. To participate in Evaluation Day you must sign up for your SRP level on your Fair Entry Form. Evaluation Day is Saturday July 19, 2014, at the Pierce County Fairgrounds.

Gymkhana

Beginner gymkhana practices begin on Wednesday, May 21 and Advanced Gymkhana practices begin on May 22.

Please note on SRP nights the Dog Project has classes on Mon. and Tues. nights, so park your trailers on the grass to the west side of the horse arena and around the round barn. Those not pulling a trailer park by the Home Ec. building. If you are not a dog project member DO NOT bring your dog.

Everyone who uses a horse for all activities at the fairgrounds are REQUIRED to pick up your horse's manure outside of the arena. There are manure forks and wheelbarrows available by the announcer's stand all summer.

Youth Mentors will be available to help you fill out your forms in various projects and classes. Feel free to stop by and ask questions.

Due May 1, 2014 to the Pierce Co. Extension office: Project fee, Horse Declaration, Equine Fair Request, Summer Riding Registration (if applicable), and Handbook Acknowledgement. Please note, a member can only declare a maximum number of 4 horses. Horseless Horse project members are required to fill out and give a horse declaration form along with project fee and other forms. Your 4-H horse "Buddy" can help you to fill it out.

If you do not yet have your Coggins results, send the forms in anyway, with a note that the Coggins papers will be coming soon. Participation in horse events is prohibited until a Negative Coggins result is received for each horse/pony.

If you have not picked up your horse handbook yet you need to stop by the UW Extension Office for your copy and to view the 2014 Winter Round Up video.

The next Horse Committee meeting is Tuesday, May 6, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. in the lower level meeting room at the Pierce Co. Office Building.

Horseless Horse meeting, Tuesday, May 6, 2014 at 6:00 p.m. in the lower level meeting room at the Pierce Co. Office Bldg, before the regular horse committee meeting. If you have your fair entry forms already and need help filling them out please bring them to the horseless horse or horse committee meetings. Youth Mentors will be available to help you fill out your forms in various projects and classes. Or you can bring the form to SRP or Gymkhana practices to get help filling out entries.

Horse Bowl and Hippology, there is still time to join the horse bowl and hippology teams as they practice and gain knowledge for the WI 4-H State meet Saturday May 10, 2014, in Wausau, WI. Speaking and Demonstrations are Fri. May 9, 2014 at the state meet. This is a fun team orientated way for members to learn more about horses and gain valuable information that applies to the all around care and safety of your horse or pony. Swine Project

There will be no Swine weigh-in this spring. In an effort to protect Wisconsin's pork industry from the spread of the deadly, communicable virus among pigs, Dr. Paul McGraw, state veterinarian at the Wisconsin Department of Trade and Consumer Agriculture. Protection (DATCAP) is issuing a ban on the usual spring weighins of pigs in preparation for Wisconsin's many county fairs. Dr. McGraw also recommends only terminal swine shows be held for County Fairs. The meaning of "Terminal Show" is best described as all swine entered in a given show (fairs) are sent directly to slaughter or to a licensed livestock facility no later than or immediately following the conclusion of the exhibition. Info on this has been sent to all swine project members.

On April 19th, 2014 there will be 4 tagging teams divided among the county to ear tag pigs that will be exhibited at the 2014 Pierce County Fair. Tagging request forms <u>MUST BE COMPLETED AND IN THE UWEX OFFICE BY FRIDAY APRIL 11th, 2014! All swine project members were emailed and regular mailed this info. If you did not get it you MUST call the Extension Office to have one mailed to you.</u>

Goat Project

Meat Kid Rules for Fair

Goats will be weighed on Saturday, April 19, 2014 at the Pierce County Fairgrounds from 10am to 11am. A Goat Workshop will follow for ALL project members.

To qualify for the Auction Sale, a goat must weigh at minimum of 60 pounds.

A goat must be weighed and tagged at the Pierce County site in order to show at the Pierce County Fair in the Market Animal Class.

Sheep Project

Sheep County Weigh-In Specific rules for WETHERS OR EWES:

Wethers and ewes (cannot also be shown in a breed class) will be weighed on Saturday, April 19, 2014, at the Pierce County Fairgrounds from 10:00 to 11:00 am. Each wether or ewe must be born on January 1, 2014, or after to be eligible for the Meat Animal Auction.

Maximum weight at spring weigh-in is 75 pounds. m. To qualify for the Auction Sale, a wether or ewe must weigh between 95-160 pounds.

A wether or ewe must live grade prime or choice to be sold at the Auction.

A sheep must be weighed and eartagged at the April 19, 2014 Pierce County weigh-in site in order to show at the Pierce County Fair in the Market Animal Class.

Small Animal and Poultry

Rabbit and Cavy 4-H Youth Annual Swap and Fun Show

The Small Animal Committee will once again be hosting its annual spring fun show on May 10th at the fairgrounds.

Swap - Doors open at 7:00. \$2 admission for buyers and sellers. All poultry MUST be blood tested before the swap.

NO PIGS ALLOWED.

Rabbit & Cavy Show

Entries taken from 8:00-9:45. Entry fees are \$2.00 per animal entered. There is no limit to the number of animals you can enter and you can enter more than one animal in the same class. Show starts at 10:00. Classes will be broken down by breed, sex, age, and possibly color depending on the number of entries in a breed. We will follow breeds and classes according to the American Rabbit Breeders Association Standard of Perfection. Awards will be given.

Some general rules are as follows: All cages must have a solid bottom, Each exhibitor is responsible for handling their own animals, Rabbits and cavies only are allowed in the showroom, Any animal that is found to be unhealthy will be removed from the show, No unauthorized people are allowed behind the judging tables. All proceeds will go towards improvements to rabbit, cavy and poultry building and project areas. This is **not** limited to youth in Pierce County so if you have friends in other counties or in Minnesota please invite them to come and share in some rabbit and cavy fun. This is also an excellent opportunity for members who are looking for animals as we usually have several breeders come with animals for sale. 
