## National 4-H Volunteer e-Forum

An e-Forum is a method used to provide professional development to volunteers and has a virtual and face to face component. 2017 will be the first time that an e-Forum will be held at a national level. This been developed in concept to make aware of the strengths, resources, and experiences from different 4-H programs across the nation. The target of the e-Forum is volunteers who are in the roles of club organizational leaders, project/subject leaders, committee members, and advisory boards. Youth volunteers can also attend the programs.

There are three sessions: October 5, November 2, and December 7. The sessions will begin at 5:45pm and will end by 7:30pm.

On October 5 the content will be about Cultivating an Environment for Growing True Leaders. This will focus on strategies for more effective club interactions. On November 2<sup>nd</sup> the content will be "Stem"ming into Animal Science, Growing True Leaders. This will help volunteers gain ideas for educational youth sessions that involve Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) for their project areas. On December 7th the content will be Helping 4-Her's Grow in Life and Work. This will let volunteers share ideas, receive resources, and see a variety of successful programs that help youth focus on lifelong learning, workforce readiness, and career exploration.

# The Wider Impact of Outdoor Learning

Hands-on learning outdoors not only engages children's interests, it engages a wider spectrum of intelligences as well. This means that more children will find themselves interested in the outdoor learning experience. This interest makes the content more relevant, which results in increased school performance. Outdoor learning helps children develop a "sense of place," through which children can make connections to the natural and human communities in which they reside. Teachers can appreciate the increased student engagement that an outdoor classroom provides; nothing is more satisfying than seeing students actively interested in what is being taught! There is an energy for learning outdoors that we just do not see in the regular classroom. Students may not be able to adequately identify the exact source of their increased engagement at the time, but will carry many happy memories with them, which is probably the most important aspect of outdoor learning. It can develop positive memories of both school and the outdoors. Those affirmative experiences can color our views of both for many years to come.

As you know, the State of WI moved to an on-line enrollment system known as 4-H ON-LINE a few years back. So once again 4-H ONLINE will allow individuals to re-enroll at home using a computer and they can enroll and monitor their own enrollment records beginning on September 15<sup>th</sup>. Lost or forgotten your username or password? Call the UW-Extension Office and we can look up your username (your username is the email you

used to sign up for the account). For forgotten passwords click the - *I forgot my password* link (you will need to have your email in there) and a password will be sent to your email. # 2017 Herdsmanship Results

All 4-H Clubs and FFA Chapters are automatically entered into herdsmanship. Based on the number of animals they sign up in their fair entry forms, clubs and chapters are split into either large or small herds. It is a premium award for the club or chapter to maintain a clean, safe, and creative display of their animals to the public fairgoers. The exhibit is planned and constructed mainly by exhibitors, and it is judged on a variety of topics. Topics include: cleanliness, neatness, and general appearance of exhibits, conduct and appearance of exhibitors present, storage of feed and equipment, originality of decorations, and quality of animals. Species judged in this year's competition included beef, swine, sheep, dairy, rabbit, poultry, goat, and horses. Judges this year were pleased with the creativity of the exhibits!
