Organizational Leader Training

These trainings are designed to help you become a more effective Organizational Leaders by exploring available resources and answering your questions. Topics will include: 4-H Online, Club By-laws, Parliamentary Procedure and Club meetings. All leaders are welcome. March, May and September trainings will cover additional topics. <u>Starting fall of 2017, Wisconsin will replace the</u> <u>MAQA (Meat Animal Quality Assurance) program</u> <u>with the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals</u> (YQCA) national program. This new and interactive program will allow youth to complete an online/web based training or instructor led training for the annual quality assurance certification. YQCA was created for youth in the Beef, Dairy, Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep and Swine projects. YQCA will provide a common frame work for food animal quality assurance programs which will:

- Strengthen the youth educational experience
- Improve the care of food animals
- Promote a higher level of consumer food safety

This program allows for the consistency of information being taught to youth in all states and in all species of animals.

VIP Meeting

All NEW volunteers will have to complete a background check through GIS, and take the "Mandated Reporter" training, done online, and come in for the "VIP Meeting" with our 4H Agent, Frank. So first thing to do to become a leader is: enroll in 4-H as a leader. Go to your family page <u>https://wi.4honline.com/</u> and click - add adult. Complete this registration. This will trigger an email to come to you from the state for a background check. It will come from GIS and/or Angela Schultz. Watch for that and get it complete as you will NOT be able to be a leader in Pierce Co. 4-H without having a background check done. You will only have a short window to reply to this email.

Then you will also need to take the Mandated Reporter Training and you can find this on your individual profile page, click on "trainings" (toward the top middle of the screen). It will take you to a new screen, click on "Sign Up for a Training" and follow the next screens through to take the Mandated Reporter online training. It will tell us when you have this completed.

Then you must attend a VIP Meetings with Frank. **Please call/email ahead to sign up** - at least by noon the business day before the meeting to let us know you plan to attend. We need at least three people to hold the session. They are about an hour long, and will be the following dates:

- Sunday, January 28th- Seyforth building-Time 4:15 p.m.
- Monday, Feb. 12th River Falls Library Time: 6:30 p.m.

Once you enroll, complete the background check, take the MRT online and get to a VIP Meeting with Frank we can confirm you as a Leader in 4-H.

Until all of these things are done you will not be an active leader with Pierce Co. 4-H or able to start working with our youth until you have it all complete. Let us know if you have any questions!

Wisconsin 4-H Horse Association Scholarship

High school seniors and post-secondary students currently in their first year of higher education are eligible to apply. A minimum GPA 2.0 out of 4.0 is required to apply. A minimum of four consecutive years in the 4-H Horse & Pony Project (regular member or horseless horse). Applicants must attend an accredited, post-secondary school/program (i.e. 2- or 4-year collage or professional technical program, Farm & Industry short course program, vocational college or training of at least one school year in length). Robotics

NEW TO ROBOTICS CLASSES - There is now a \$5 fee for each class you take. This fee will help pay for replacement parts, new robotic technology, new robots, storage for equipment and more. So if you are taking 102 it will be a \$5 fee and if you are also taking 202 it is another \$5 fee.

NXT's 102 Introduction to Lego Robotics January 25th & February 1st, 2018 (Grades 4-12)

LEGO MINDSTORMS NXT is the second generation of robotics products from the LEGO group. These robots will introduce entry-level robotics with state-of-the art hardware and easy-to-use programming software. This robotics workshop series youth will spend two nights building and programing the LEGO MINDSTORMS Robots. From using light sensors, touch sensors, ultrasonic sensors to using sound sensors, youth grades 4th through grades 12 will use their critical thinking skills. Two sessions will be offered and youth are welcome to participate in one or both of these nights. MUST REGISTER! CLASSES WILL FILL UP! NXT's 202 Robotics the NeXT Generation February 13th, 20 & 22nd, 2018 (Grades 4-12)

The Pierce County 4-H volunteers will be offering a new three class robotics series for youth who have attended one or more robotics workshop series. Youth will have the opportunity to enhance their skill sets in the areas of robot construction, computer programming and evaluation. Using the LEGO MINDSTORMS NXT 2.0 education kits as well as the NXT LEGO expansion kits youth will have the chance to use more functioning parts to enhance functionality of designs and will explore a different side of computer programing. The expansion kits have an additional 900 LEGO parts!! We will build a standard driving base with a claw in this 3 class series. First class we'll build the bot. Second and third we will program our bot to transverse a few Winter Olympics themed courses, and teach them to clap. Cost: \$5.00

NXT's 203 NXT MINDSTORM 2.0 March 13th, 20th, 22nd, 2018 (Grades 6-12)

As we are making our way through the robotics season plan on attending our advanced robotics class for grades 6-12. Using the LEGO MINDSTORMS NXT 2.0 education kit and new LEGO expansion kits with over 900 more parts. Youth will have the opportunity to build a Sumo Bot and compete with the other teams to see who can build and a program their bot to follow the rules and win by staying in the ring.

The first class we will work through a few examples of building stability into our designs and then build the basic Sumo Bot. Second Class we will discuss the rules and how to program the Bot to follow them. Then test our bots out. Third class will be focusing on adjusting our designs and programs to help our bot become the 'king of the ring'.

NXT's 301 NXT MINDSTORM 2.0 March 29th, April 10th, 17th, and 26th 2018 (Grades 8-12)

As we are making our way through the robotics season plan on attending our advanced robotics class for grades 8-12. Using the LEGO MINDSTORMS NXT 2.0 education kit and new LEGO expansion kits with over 900 more parts.

This is an advanced class - we will be learning how to make 2 programing bricks talk to one another using Bluetooth. This might require some "out of the box" thinking. This class is targeted at individuals who have attended more than 6 previous classes. First class will be going through the programing of 2 two bricks - each team of 2 individuals will work together to send data between the bricks and respond. Second class we will be building 2 different types of bots that will need to work together. Third and possibly fourth class we will work to get these 2 bots to work well together to accomplish a task. **Cost: \$5.00**

Show content is a collaborative effort between company members and their director. Each Drama Company member contributes ideas for the show and works with the group to problem solve issues on the set and in the script. Drama Company takes their show on to the Wisconsin State Fair where they perform for fair goers from across the state.

4-H Art Team creates artwork around the theme of the Wisconsin 4-H and Youth Conference as well as designing and organizing the WI 4-H and Youth Conference art exhibit, reception and guided exhibit tours. The team members also teach seminars and train to be peer leaders for county and regional events including the Wisconsin State Fair. The 4-H Art Team is led by a professional artist who teaches team members artistic techniques using a variety of mediums.

4-H Communications Team tells the Wisconsin 4-H story using multiple forms of communication, including: photo, video, social media, blogging and writing about club, county and state 4-H events. Team members develop a mixed-media presentation for delegates attending the Wisconsin 4-H & Youth Conference, as well as taking photos and videos of performances. They create promotional video clips for 4-H & Youth Conference and write articles about 4-H events. Communications Team members learn an abundance of problem solving, writing, photography and leadership skills as members of their team.

4-H Art Beat

Art Beat was created for 4-H members in grades 3-5 and their parents and leaders, 4-H Art Beat is the introductory program for Wisconsin 4-H Arts and Communication and will be held March 16-17 at our State 4-H Camp, Upham Woods in the Wisconsin Dells. The weekend features a look at a variety of arts projects including music, drama, visual arts, art in nature, and more! Camp begins Friday evening at 7 pm and ends Saturday afternoon at 3 pm.

4-H members will explore their own creativity while discovering the great variety of 4-H Arts & Communication experiences available to them now and in the near future. Session leaders will be 4-H older youth, adult leaders and 4-H staff members with a wealth of experience to share. Youth and adult participants will rotate through a variety of sessions which are hands-on and active and held at various sites throughout camp, including outdoors. Both youth and adult participants stay in the cabins on cabin hill. Adult applicants please note: All adults will be considered camp chaperones - if you are not already an active 4-H volunteer you must complete the requirements to become one before camp - contact your county UW-Extension Office.

The \$50.00 per person fee (both youth and adults must pay the registration fee) will include all materials and supplies, special snacks, overnight lodging and breakfast and lunch on Saturday. Why not get a whole carload of youth and adults together from your county for some genuine 4-H bonding time?

The Pierce County 4-H Adult Advisors, Inc. will award scholarships of \$400 each to a 4-H member who will be entering college, vocational school or short course the fall of the current 4-H club year. The qualifications and more information will be emailed to all high school seniors in the next week or find it on our website.

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Scholarship:

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$10,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin students pursuing higher education in 2018. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by March 15, 2018, 5:00 pm.

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth, development and leadership, academic performance and future educational goals.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships, students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least one year; have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2018-2019 academic school year. All applications must adhere to the strict conventions outlined below. Any application that does not meet these requirements (including all document names) will not be considered. All documents must be sent as PDFs (preferred method) or Word Documents as attachments to one email. Any other cloud/internet shared documents will be NOT be accepted (such as Google Docs). Use these tips to ensure recipes are accurate. clear, and uniform throughout your cookbook.

- List ingredients in the order used. Make sure all ingredients are included in the directions.
- Include all amounts and container sizes: 2 (8-oz.) cans. 1 (14-oz.) pkg. Use parenthesis to separate amounts.
- Abbreviate measurements in the ingredients list (see standard) abbreviations below), but spell them out in the directions.
- Be consistent with names, ingredients, etc., e.g., don't use "1 c. butter" on some recipes and "2 sticks butter" on others.
- 5. Use ingredient names in the directions, e.g., use "Combine flour and sugar" rather than statements such as "Combine the first two ingredients."
- 6. Include temperatures and all cooking, chilling, baking, or freezing times.
- Make sure ingredients and directions are clear, thorough, and accurate. For example, don't assume the reader knows how to make yeast bread.


