Dear 4-H Family and Friends,

"Spring breathes new life into the world around us." As spring approaches, so does the month of April, and with the month of April, comes National Service Learning month in 4-H. Let's breathe new life into others through service learning opportunities this spring.



What is service learning? (Credit to Iowa State Extension and Outreach)

Service-Learning projects take community service or volunteer projects to the next level by emphasizing both service and learning to create a more meaningful experience for youth.

<u>5 Step Plan for Successful Service Learning (Credit to Iowa State Extension and Outreach)</u>

1. **Investigation** - Youth determine the needs in their community. This might be accomplished by conducting a community needs assessment or another type of assessment. Once a community need has been identified, young people conduct some form of research or investigation to document the extent and nature of the problem in their community.

2. Preparation- Youth share ideas to meet community needs and access available resources, discuss what they can do to help, and how they can make it happen. This step may also include developing a common vision, timelines for success, a project budget, etc.

3. Action- The service portion of Service-Learning. To make the project more purposeful and meaningful, youth take on leadership roles and are actively involved in all parts of the service project.

4. Reflection- Youth participate in and lead activities that allow them to assess their accomplishments, to examine the impact of their work in the community, and to consider how they could improve their action plan for future projects.

5. Demonstration & Celebration-Youth celebrate their successes and educate others on what they have learned, the impact of their work, and recommendations for future projects.

We encourage all clubs in March to plan at least one service learning project for the month of April. Find a project that supports your member's interests and supports others in a great need. Find more information on how to register your service learning event through national 4-H later on in this Informant.

VIP Meeting

New 4-H Leaders, if you haven't got the chance to go to a VIP meeting yet, here's another chance!

All **NEW** volunteers will have to complete a background check through GIS, and take the "Mandated Reporter" training, done online, and come in for the "VIP Meeting" with our 4H Agent, Frank. So first thing to do to become a leader is: enroll in 4-H as a leader. Go to your family page https://wi.4honline.com/ and click - add adult. Complete this registration. This will trigger an email to come to you from the state for a background check. It will come from GIS and/or Angela Schultz. Watch for that and get it complete as you will NOT be able to be a leader in Pierce Co. 4-H without having a background check done. You will only have a short window to reply to this email. Then you will also need to take the Mandated Reporter Training and you can find this on your individual profile page, click on "trainings" (toward the top middle of the screen). It will take you to a new screen, click on "Sign Up for a Training" and follow the next screens through to take the Mandated Reporter online training. It will tell us when you have this completed.

Then you must attend a VIP Meetings with Frank. **Please call/email ahead to sign up** We need at least three people to hold the session. They are about an hour long. The next one is set for: Tuesday, March 6th, 2018 at the Courthouse Annex Room, 6:30p.m.

Until all 3 of these things are done you will not be an active leader with Pierce Co. 4-H or able to start working with our youth so complete these steps soon and once you have it all complete we will make you active in the system.

Key Award Application

 The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community.

- To be eligible, candidates must meet basic requirements for this award and must be at least a Junior in High School, or older and must have completed at least four or more years of 4-H work, and three or more years of leadership.
- 3. The other requirements must be met, and when a blank is provided for a date, these requirements must be met in different years; community service, club leadership assistance in mentorship for at least 4 different 4-H'ers to assist them with life skills, or have served as chairperson for at least one club event.
- Held a local or county/district 4-H office for at least two years. (Include president, vicepresident, secretary, treasurer, reporter, plus others).
- Service to county 4-H programs or helped at events at least three times during the past three years. Committees must be countywide or larger in scope.
- 6. Completed and excelled at 4-H project work in at least four different project areas.
- Attended regional, state, or national events during the past three years such as National 4-H Congress, National 4-H Conference, National Shooting Sports Team, State Fair, CWF, State 4-H Arts Team (s), Out of State Service Learning, Area Animal Science Days, State Dog or Horse events, others.

High school seniors and post-secondary students currently in their first year of higher education are eligible to apply. A minimum GPA 2.0 out of 4.0 is required to apply. A minimum of four consecutive years in the 4-H Horse & Pony Project (regular member or horseless horse). Applicants must attend an accredited, post-secondary school/program (i.e. 2- or 4-year collage or professional technical program, Farm & Industry short course program, vocational college or training of at least one school year in length). <u>Attention 4-H & FFA Swine Exhibitors</u> 2018 Pierce County Fair Swine Show will be Terminal

New rules regarding movement of swine into and within Wisconsin from the Department of Ag, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) have been put into state law in late 2017:

- No person may move swine within Wisconsin unless the herd of origin has tested negative for porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome(PRRS) and swine enteric coronavirus disease(SECD) conducted not more than 90 days prior to movement. If a herd tests positive it will be quarantined until a herd plan is developed and approved by DATCP. Animals originating from outside WI will need an import permit, veterinary certificate indicating health status and PRRS/SECD status. They will be quarantined until a herd plan is developed.
- Feeder pigs purchased in the spring must have a certificate of testing from the original herd indicating PRRS/SECD status.
- Swine may be moved to 1 exhibition and directly to slaughter without a test. For our educational purposes with Pierce County 4-H & FFA exhibitors, that one exhibition will be assumed to be the 2018 terminal Pierce County Fair Swine Show.
- All other swine movements in WI of any swine need a negative PRRS/SECD test within 90 days of movement or DATCP approved herd control plan

2018 Pierce County Fair Swine Show will be a terminal show all swine must be loaded onto trucks going to slaughter plant or to a sales barn then to slaughter plant.

Spring 2018 Tagging for Pierce County Fair Animals

In April 2018, the Pierce County 4-H & FFA Livestock Committee will conduct on farm tagging, there will be no Spring 2018 weigh-in offered. Tagging request forms will be sent out to all exhibitors signed up for the Swine project. Exhibitors will be required to provide a copy of their negative PRRS/SECD test from the herd of origin PRIOR to the tagging team scheduling a tagging visit to your premises.

If there is no negative PRRS/SECD paperwork provided, the tagging team will need to have a copy of your DATCP approved herd health plan AND the exhibitor must work out arrangements with the tagging team for swine ear tagging <u>within the quarantine rules</u>.

If you plan on moving swine to more than the Pierce County Fair (for example attending a jackpot show or some other non-terminal swine exhibition), you need to test your herd 90 days before the fair. More information from DATCP State Veterinarian Dr. McGraw on how to test for PRRS and SECD can be seen on a previously recorded webinar at: <u>https://fyi.uwex.edu/youthlivestock/swine-health-rule/</u>

Please note: As usual, <u>all swine</u> will still need a Pre-fair vet check within 30 days of the Pierce County Fair in order to show.
