

VIRTUAL 4-H CLOTHING REVUE

- **Participants can enter up to five items:** Articles can be sewn on conventional or serger machine or knitted or crocheted. A garment is considered one article of clothing (separates, such as a skirt, shorts, top, blouse, or jacket). An outfit must present a “total look” (such as a dress, suit, jumpsuit, skirt and top, coat, etc...).
- During the Revue each entry/garment will be modeled by the youth who made it (garment for self) or their guest (garment for others). This is not meant as a 2020 County Fair replacement as the Fair is cancelled. It is meant as a fun educational experience and a chance to get some comments and feedback from a judge. Ribbons and awards will be mailed.

- As with an in-person fashion revue, youth will share their knowledge about how they constructed the garment with the judge. Participants will be graded on the garment itself, their creativity in the project, and the overall appearance of the garment on the model. Check out this example [Fashion Revue Score Card](#).
- During registration, youth will need to provide a narrative about each garment they are entering. Narratives should be about 45 seconds in length (about 150 words) and will be read while the garment is being modeled at the Revue.

Try to answer the following questions when writing your narrative:

- Where will you wear this garment?
- Why did you choose the accessories you will use?
- What did you learn while constructing this garment?
- List other garments completed or other sewing projects.
- List interests, family, 4-H club, school, and age.

Narrative example:

Chrissy Clover will definitely stand out at the fair this year. While everyone else is riding rides and playing games, she will be reporting the news in this linen, off-white suit. This semi-fitted flared jacket has front & back princess seams. The jacket has buttoned closure and is lined. The pullover top is sleeveless with a dart on each side. The skirt has back darts, waistband, back zipper, and a hemline slit. The pearl necklace and earrings help to add an extra special look to the outfit. A five-year member of the Clover Club, Chrissy is very active in Horses and Photography. Her parents are George and Georgia Clover. Chrissy attends Theisen Middle School. In her free time, she enjoys reading, singing, and having fun!
