# Enroll now for the 2020-2021 4-H Year

A few things to know –

- 1. If you were an active member last year your membership will carry over. Do NOT start a new membership. This will cause problems and the system will read matching addresses or information and it will show dupe records and cancel both. Be sure to use your old login and password. If you forgot your password please click the I forgot my password. Your login is your family email. If you forgot that please call the office. ONLY BRAND NEW families should create a new account.

A **project** guide was also emailed. The project guide will help with choosing projects for the year. Or call the office 715-273-6781 with questions or if you would like either of these things sent to you regular mail.
- 2. **BE SURE to choose the correct club.** We are having issues right now with changing clubs so at the beginning when it asks you to choose a club from the drop down be sure to select the correct club you are joining. If you can't remember PLEASE call here and we can tell you what club you were in. If you are making a club change this year please be sure you know the name of the new club you want to join, and enter it now.
- 3. Please select all the projects you want to enter now (there is a limit on the amount you can enter) so put them in when signing up now as the system is having trouble allowing you to go back in and add a project after you are pending or confirmed (hopefully this will soon be fixed) but for now, please select all the projects you want to do before submitting the enrollment. There is a project guide attached for help with what projects are. If you would like this project guide regular mailed to you please let us know. Be sure to enter in any projects now that you may want to take to the 2021 Pierce County Fair.
- 4. Once you are in your account please complete the membership for each member enrolling and hit submit once you are finished. ONLY enroll a parent or adult that wants to be a volunteer leader. All volunteers will have to go through the 4 steps of the Youth Protection process (if you were a confirmed leader you will come over as confirmed and will not have to redo any of it until your background check is up for renew).
- 5. **PLEASE CALL US WITH ANY QUESTIONS!** 715-273-6781. We are here to help and want to make this an easy transition into this new system. We are seeing a few glitches that they are working on and we hope they are fixed soon but the enrollment part should be ready to go so get your family enrolled now. Just make sure you select the correct club. If you come across anything about payments PLEASE DISREGARD that part. Do **not** pay your club dues or anything through this new system. Hopefully that part is turned off.

### **Youth Equality Workshop**

This fall the University of Minnesota Community Youth Development group is partnering with the Youth Leadership Initiative to host a series of free virtual Youth Equity workshops and technical assistance. These workshops will introduce what it means to use an equity lens in youth work. Each session will provide different frameworks and concepts to analyze our mindsets, behaviors and structures. Participants will reflect on their personal role in creating equitable systems for young people to thrive. Everyone will walk away feeling energized to change and will have practical ideas to improve their programs. The interactive sessions will be held from 9-noon (CT) and cover these key areas:

- <u>Dismantling White Supremacy Culture in Our Organizations</u>, Oct 23. Learn about white supremacy cultural norms, the five key elements of using a racial equity lens, and actions that can dismantle white supremacy. Register.
- Addressing Hurtful Ways that Adultism Shows Up, Nov. 6. Explore how adultism is harmful to young people, examine how these behaviors show up in nonprofits, and identify actions to create change. Register.
- Sharing Power with Youth, Nov 20. Examine different youth engagement frameworks, define equity from a youth perspective, and learn how to share power with young people. Register.

# Statewide 4-H Educational Experiences or 2021 4-H Award Trips Update

Due to the uncertainty regarding COVID-19, National 4-H Council, with support and guidance from national Extension leadership, including the 4-H Program Leaders Working Group, has decided that the 2021 National 4-H Educational Experiences will not be held in person. In addition to National 4-H Council's announcement, Wisconsin has made the decision that Space Camp and the American Spirit Experience will not be held in person in 2021. - National Youth STEM Summit Virtual

- Leadership Washington Focus Virtual
- National 4-H Conference Virtual
- Space Camp No Wisconsin Delegation
- American Spirit Experience Canceled
- 2021 National 4-H Congress To Be Determined (Does Not Meet at National 4-H Conference Center and is held in November) .

Several important factors and considerations guided the decision to move from in-person to virtual:

- 1. Health and safety of youth, adults, staff and volunteers is a primary concern
- 2. Equitable access for all youth at national events; currently 50% of Land Grant Universities have restricted travel and many have indicated continued restrictions through Summer of 2021
- 3. Challenge of retrofitting the National 4-H Conference Center to meet social distancing requirements
- 4. Opportunity to invest in virtual capabilities and leverage innovation from Extension and youth.

### **Tractor Supply Company Fundraising Campaign for 4-H**

Each year Tractor Supply Company (TSC) does two fundraising campaigns that benefit Wisconsin 4-H. The fall campaign is October 7 through October 18. For every \$1 paper clover sold at a Wisconsin TSC, 90 cents comes back to the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation to be used for leadership activities.

In previous years, the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation has offered an incentive to 4-H clubs to plan an in-store activity or display during the Paper Clover Campaign. This year, TSC is **requesting no physical presence from 4-H programs at their stores including outdoor spaces like parking lots.** So we are doing something a bit different. We are asking that clubs get creative with their social media, emails, displays (stand-alone – not staffed) or any other promotion. Any club that does a promotion with a store the week before or during the fall paper clover campaign and provides the Foundation with photos, clippings and/or screen shots, the Foundation will give that club \$20. And, if the promotion is chosen as one of the five best, the Foundation will give the club an additional \$50.

### Here are the rules:

- Ask the 4-H Foundation (<u>Joanne@Wis4HFoundation.org</u>) for information about the TSC store (locations and store manager name).
  - Call the store manager with ideas about what you would like to do (display, photo board, contact
    with local media, social media, etc.). Your activity must be the week prior to the paper clover
    campaign or during the paper clover campaign and must promote 4-H and the TSC paper clover
    campaign.
  - Ask for ideas from the store manager and permission to move forward with ideas that you believe will work.
  - Get promoting!
  - Take photos and get those to the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation as soon as possible (especially if it's early in the campaign we will use those photos on social media to promote the campaign).
  - Report your experience to the Foundation via email Joanne@Wis4HFoundation.org. Include a
    description of what you did and include what store, the date(s) of the promotion, the results of
    your promotion and at least one photo of your promotion. Reports must be received by
    November 1, 2020, to be eligible for cash awards.

We are going to have to use all our creativity with social networks, emails, displays, and anything else you can think of to get people to donate. Let's get promoting Wisconsin 4-H!

# SAVE THE DATE - Leadership Day will be Dec. 5th 2020 and will be virtual.

<u>All Adult Leaders</u> - There will be more VIP Training sessions held later this Fall for becoming an adult leader/volunteer. Reminder that you must have completed the 4 steps, 1. Enroll as leader in 4-H Online, 2. Do a state Back Ground Check, 3. Complete the Mandated Reporter Training and 4. take a VIP Training. If you were a confirmed leader you will not have to do anything except enroll. If you started these trainings but did not complete before the crossover to the new 2.0, you will probably have to redo some of the steps. Every adult 4-H volunteer of Pierce County must be a confirmed leader in our system before you can start working with the youth.

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WISCONSIN 4-H INDUCTS NINE INTO HALL OF FAME MADISON—Wisconsin 4-H Youth Development is excited to announce the 2020 Hall of Fame Laureates including nine volunteers, supporters, and staff who have impacted Wisconsin 4-H, and two local leaders from Pierce County are inductees this year. "As I read the biographies of these laureates, I was amazed at all they have each accomplished and feel sincere gratitude for their tireless championing of 4-H," says Simmons, Wisconsin 4-H Program Manager. "It is an honor to recognize these laureates for their leadership and contribution to 4-H in Wisconsin. My commitment to these individuals is to uphold their legacy by continuing the great work that they started so many years ago, the work of developing civically engaged leaders, and creating opportunities for all youth to belong to and thrive in this life-changing organization. "The Wisconsin 4-H Hall of Fame was established to recognize 4-H volunteers, financial supporters, staff and pioneers who made major contributions to the 4-H movement at the local, state and national levels. The candidates represent 4-H in the broadest sense -people who had an impact on the lives of children, their community or state through significant contributions of time, energy or financial resources to 4-H and its members. Congratulations to Dewey Wachholz and Kathy Geraets!

<u>Dr. Duane "Dewey" Wachholz</u> enjoyed a distinguished career in Animal Science Agriculture and was a well-known role model and teacher of 4-H clientele across the state of Wisconsin. He was a constant presence at county, district and state 4-H Livestock events for many years. Whether it was Judging contests, leader training or youth shows, Dewey was there interacting with 4-H youth and adults. He got to know many of the youth who were interested in animal science and encouraged them to pursue further education. His warm personality and good sense of humor made him a popular Extension Specialist among the 4-H

participants. Dewey was a faculty member at UW-Platteville and UW-River Falls and a small percentage of his job (10-33%) included Extension responsibilities. Even though his Specialist job was only part-time, Dewey was always willing to work with 4-H and always gave more than was expected. Dewey served as a Youth Livestock Specialist from 1974 until 2001. He played a key role in the development of Area Animal Science Days each one of those years, led 4-H leader training in the Meat Animal Livestock projects, consulted with many counties about their Livestock auctions and educational programs. He also was a resource for volunteers who coached judging teams.

Kathy Geraets, an outstanding 4-H volunteer in Pierce County for 43 years has served in a variety of leadership roles: Rock Elm Skyrockets 4-H Club General Leader, a countywide Photography project leader, and on the Pierce County 4-H Adult Advisors Council to name a few. When Kathy took on the leadership role of her club, a goal was set to keep young people involved in the community. She nurtured a robust partnership between the 4-H Club and the Elmwood area. Through her leadership and grant writing, the club revitalized the gardens at Veteran's Park, created and placed the UFO sighting signs, created a butterfly garden for the local care center, and annually planted more than 20 flower containers to beautify the town.

Kathy exudes confidence and pride as she speaks about what 4-H has meant to her and how 4-H participation keeps both young people and parents involved. For Kathy that's a true sign of achievement—working together to support the group and make a difference in the place that you live.
