This is the top award that any county 4-H member can receive and is considered a prestigious honor for high level achievement through-out a young person's comprehensive 4-H career. Key Awards are given out each year to a 4-H member that is at least a junior in high school, who has completed 4 or more years of 4-H work, and has completed 3 or more years of leadership. At the end of WW I, the Pierce County Board, appropriated money for an Extension Agent through the cooperation of the College of Agriculture and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. On August 1, 1920, H.G. Seyforth was appointed to fill this position and held it for 37 years until October 1, 1957.

In the Spring of 1921 the first 4-H club members were signed up and by July 1 there were 82 4-H members. These members were organized into project clubs with the most popular being Corn, Potato, Calf, Poultry, and Sewing.


In September 1921, the first 4-H projects were presented

at the Pierce County Fair. For the first five years, H.G. Seyforth was "the leader," working almost entirely alone. He visited many of the 100 rural schools. Most of these schools had

to be visited in the spring as the roads were not kept open for winter driving.

UPDATE ON 2021 EDUCATIONAL 4-H AWARD TRIPS

These truly are ever changing and challenging times!! Information and updates are coming at us from all directions and today is no exception. Due to the uncertainty regarding COVID-19, National 4-H Council, with support and guidance from national Extension leadership, including the 4-H Program Leaders Working Group, has decided that the 2021 National 4-H Educational Experiences will not be held in person. In addition to National 4-H Council's announcement, Wisconsin has made the decision that Space Camp and the American Spirit Experience will not be held in person in 2021. This is the information that we currently know regarding 2021 trips, including those that are likely to be offered:

- Citizenship Washington Focus, Virtual
- Wisconsin 4-H Youth Conference, likely virtual
- Space Camp No Wisconsin Delegation
- National 4-H Conference nominee Virtual
- 2021 National 4-H Congress TBD
- American Spirit Experience has been cancelled.

Pierce County will be taking applications for these virtual 4-H Award trips soon. Applicants can anticipate there being some cost sharing available and that virtual experiences could range from approximately \$100 - \$300 total cost with the 4-H Adult Advisors providing a minimum of 40% of the cost to trip awardees selected to participate. 2021 Pierce County Livestock Tagging Information

Due to the current Covid 19 restrictions, there will be NO INITIAL WEIGH IN or IN-PERSON TAGGING this year for any of the species. Please see species specific information below.

<u>Beef & Swine:</u> We will be hosting a *DRIVE THRU TAG PICK UP* day on April 10, 2021 at the Pierce County Fairgrounds from 8am-noon. <u>Everyone that is planning to exhibit Market beef or swine at the fair MUST come on that day to get their tags.</u> **Sorry, NO EXCEPTIONS will be made for tag pick up.**

All exhibitors will tag their own animals & will need to send photos of your tagged animals & needed information back to us no later than May 1, 2021.

** Please watch your email for complete instructions about the tag pick up in a few weeks **

NOTE/CHANGE: To help alleviate the cost of the tags, each exhibitor will only be given the first two tag sets for each species (2 for beef &/or 2 for swine). You may still tag additional animals but additional tag sets will need to be purchased for \$4 per set. So if you plan to tag 4 hogs, you will get 2 sets for free & then purchase two additional sets.

<u>Sheep & Goats:</u> There will not be a tag pick up day for sheep & goats. Instead, we will do the same as last year & use each animal's scrapies tag for identification. You will also need to return photos of your tagged animals & needed information back to us no later than April 17, 2021.

** Please watch for an email with complete instructions in a few weeks **

IMPORTANT - MEAT ANIMAL EXHIBITORS that plan to tag more animals than you can bring to the fair be sure to contact the lockers now to reserve processing spots for your extra animals. The Livestock Committee only has spaces reserved for the number of animals that could potentially be at the fair.

New Rule for Swine Exhibitors:

Ractopamine Hydrochloride or Paylean, as it is more commonly known as, has been banned by all Commercial processors as it is illegal in any pork shipments made to China or the European Union. Therefore, we have banned the use of this product in any hogs that will be shown at the Pierce County Fair as well. The Pierce County Livestock Committee is currently working on testing procedures for enforcing these rules as well as penalties should this rule be violated. Complete information about this rule will be sent to all swine exhibitors very soon.

Rules Meetings:

NOTE WORKSHOP SHEET CHANGE: In effort to simplify things a bit, the Pierce County Livestock Committee has decided that going forward all exhibitors will now need to fill out the Wisconsin Youth Livestock Educational Form regardless if they attend their workshop in person or online. This form will completely replace the traditional blue workshop sheet we have put out in the past. The WYL Education Form ALONG with each exhibitor's YQCA certificate can be turned in via email to the livestock committee at any time but all workshop forms & YQCA Certificates are due NO LATER than JULY 21, 2021! Two Important notes:

<u>BEEF exhibitors that attended Kids N Cows day in October or the Virtual Workshop on December 15th, we have a record of who attended & you will not need to fill a form out for either of those two events.</u>

Submit your livestock lessons of interest for all to learn from and be recognized for your creative work!

Great news! We are releasing the next round of Livestock Lessons ending on March 5, 2021. The potential topics for your lessons are endless! We would love for you to submit your 4-H demonstrations, FFA public speaking entries, any videos and written work that aligns with work your already doing. This time period will allow us to see you talk about acquiring your animal project or caring for newborn animals. No matter what topic you choose, remember that the most impactful presentations are both accurate and engaging. Be creative, be funny, be serious, just be you! Think about something you have learned in your animal science project or something that you enjoy doing and prepare to share it.

Round 2 of the Wisconsin Livestock Lessons will include many ways for youth to show their work and interests.

For grades 3-8: (only one submission per category)

- 1. An oral video presentation.
- 2. Written Public Service Announcement (PSA).

For grades 9-13th: (only one submission per category)

- 1. An oral video presentation.
- 2. Written Public Service Announcement (PSA)
- 3. SAE Project Slides

Livestock Lessons are open to all youth who are interested in the animal projects. Each youth can enter one submission in both oral presentation and written public service announcements; and for older youth grades 9-13th they can submit an entry in the SAE Project Slides. The SAE Project Slides are a new addition to assist older youth in framing out topics of interest and explore careers, which can assist them in completing their SAE application. Submitted entries will be divided into the following grade judging categories from the 2020-2021 school year. Junior (Grades 3-5), Intermediate (Grades 6-8) and Senior (Grades 9-13).

Submissions are due March 5. The top entries in each division will receive monetary awards and may be featured on Wisconsin Youth Livestock Program social media, YouTube channels and other media outlets.
