Hello 4-Her's, Leaders and 4-H families,

I would like to first thank you for your patience during this time as we have been looking for clarification on COVID programing guidelines and this is what we were able to clarify \bigcirc . "If meeting in a county building, virtual meetings are recommended and encouraged unless the work is such that an in-person meeting is needed. All attendees must then distance themselves 6 feet from each other and wear masks. If meeting outside on county grounds (the fair grounds for example), please maintain a 6 foot distance between non family members."

NEW GUIDELINES:

At County buildings/land: (example annex building and fair grounds buildings)

Indoors:

- -Must fill out a Pierce County 4-H Event/Meeting Form stating necessity of meeting/event (link below) -Masks required
- -Distance for 6 ft between non-family members

Outside:

-Must be 6 ft between non-family members

- Non-county building/land: (example school, church, or event center)

For all Extension programs, we ask that individuals who are not fully vaccinated, including all youth under 12, wear a proper-fitting mask indoors.

If you feel a meeting/event is necessary for committees/groups to take up a matter in doors requiring timely action, limiting the total number of attendees and masks will be necessary. I have added a link to a google form for in person meetings/events, please fill out and summit this form if you feel you have a meeting that absolutely cannot be completed over outside or over zoom.

<u>4-H Clubs to Create Newest Cedar Crest Ice Cream Flavor:</u> <u>Entries Now Being Accepted</u>

Madison, WI [August 1, 2020] — <u>Cedar Crest Ice Cream</u>, Cedarburg, Wisconsin, and the <u>Wisconsin 4-H</u> <u>Foundation</u> have teamed up again to present the "Cedar Crest Ice Cream 4-H Flavor Contest" for Wisconsin 4-H clubs. More than 1600 clubs are eligible to create and submit a flavor 'recipe' with the top clubs named as finalists, and the top flavor produced for summer 2022.

According to Brenda Scheider, Executive Director of the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation, the contest is a great opportunity for 4-H youth to work together to develop and name their flavor. "The most exciting part of the contest is the winning flavor will be available through Cedar Crest beginning next July." The annual contest has already yielded popular flavors including Deep Woods, created by the Baraboo Valley 4-H Club and Wisconsin Campfire S'mores, created by the Springbrook 4-H Club of New Richmond. This year's winning flavor was Tractor Tracks, created by the Country Clover 4-H Club in Green Lake County.

A panel of ice cream experts chosen by Cedar Crest judges the entries. The company manufacturers more than 80 flavors of ice cream, along with frozen custard, sherbet and sorbet at its Manitowoc, Wisconsin, plant, and distributes products in five states. Many of the flavors now produced by Cedar Crest, including Wisconsin Campfire S'mores and Big Muddy, are a result of the contest.

- 3. Complete the Mandated Reporter Training. It is an online training in your 4-H online account.

2022-2023 Fairbook

Premium Checks

All premium checks were mailed to exhibitors on October 1st. If you have NOT cashed your check, please do so IMMEDIATELY. State aid is lost on all uncashed checks and the checks are only valid for 90 days.

Plaque Sponsorships

Previous plaque sponsors are being contacted to renew their commitment for another 2 years for the new fairbook. YQCA & RULES MEETINGS

All livestock exhibitors planning to show beef, goats, sheep or swine at the 2022 Pierce County Fair will be required to attend a rules meeting AND complete the annual YQCA training. There will be at least four dates available to attend rules meetings. Parents are not required but strongly encouraged to attend the rules meetings as well.

There will also be at least four opportunities to take the YQCA (Youth for Quality Care of Animals) training in person. However, it may also be completed online at yqca.org. Once you have completed the YQCA training, you may send an electronic copy of your certificate to the livestock committee at: <u>piercecountylivestockcommittee@gmail.com</u>. The rules meetings are being offered on the same four dates & will follow the YQCA.

Here are the dates that have been scheduled: Advance sign up will be required. Space is limited

- Nov. 17, 2021 @ Ellsworth High School Cafetorium YQCA will begin @ 6pm; Rules Mtg 7pm
- Dec. 12, 2021 @ Location to be determined YQCA will begin @ 2pm; Rules Mtg 3pm
- Jan. 15, 2022 @ Location to be determined YQCA will begin @ 9am; Rules Mtg 10am
- Feb. 21, 2021 @ Location to be determined YQCA will begin @ 6pm; Rules Mtg 7pm

* If you are required to take the YQCA for another species such as dairy, you only need to take it one time per year. You do not have to take it multiple times for multiple project areas.

<u>You will need to sign up for both the rules meetings & the YQCA separately</u>. A complete set of the livestock rules & complete details about signing up for the YQCA will be sent to project members soon. Please watch for that email.

FALL BEEF WEIGH IN & TAGGING:

The fall beef weigh in will be held on December 11, 2021 from 9-11am in the scalehouse at the Pierce County Fairgrounds. Anyone planning to sell/show a market steer or heifer must attend the fall weigh in.

- Each beef exhibitor may weigh in a maximum of FOUR animals total at the fall weigh in (regardless if they are beef, dairy beef or crossbred). Only two may be brought to the fair.
- Households with more than one exhibitor may weigh in their animals under the "family plan."

* PLEASE READ: Important tagging information for all market species - This year each exhibitor will receive the first two tag sets for free - regardless of the number of species you show. After that, any additional tag sets will be \$4 each. If you exhibit multiple species, A maximum of SIX meat animals may be tagged for the fair per exhibitor. This means if you show market beef and market hogs, you can only tag a maximum of 3 beef and 3 hogs at the initial weigh-ins OR any combination that equals six. 

Volunteers who are not currently 4-H leaders must meet the following requirements in order to access

the 4-H Online registration form for a certification workshop:

- 1. Adults age 21 and over registering must be approved county 4-H leaders through 4-H Online.
- 2. Registration is only available through 4-H Online at "Events".
- 3. Certification workshop fees are paid by credit card through 4-H Online when registering.
- 4. If a county is paying registration fees for their leaders, contact Doug Thompson or Justin Lieck for arrangements.
- 5. Complete the online National 4-H Shooting Sports training this is a \$21 credit card fee separate from the certification workshop fee and paid at time of online training. (See the link above for training details.)
- 6. Online National 4-H Shooting Sports training can be completed prior to achieving county 4-H leader status.

"TRACKS" – October 2021

Participation in wildlife & forestry activities are open to all Wisconsin 4-H club members. You can be enrolled in any 4-H project and participate in the activities.

Wildlife WHEP & Forestry 4-H Friends,

Did you know Wisconsin is home to a number of rare and uncommon mammals? In addition to a number of rare bats, Wisconsin is a heritage home to the snowshoe hare, the Canada lynx, northern flying squirrel, and American marten.

Here's more. Snowshoe hares are forest dwellers. Their coats are snow white in winter but turn brown when the snow melts. This color change takes about 10 weeks to complete. The Canada Lynx resembles a bobcat except they have sold black on the top and bottom of their tail. They have triangular ears with black tufts at the tips and are good climbers and swimmers. They are rare in Wisconsin and federally protected. The Northern flying squirrel uses its patagium (loose flap of skin between the front and hind legs) to glide between trees. They live 3-4 years and produce one litter per year between May and October. The American Marten is a member of the weasel family.

They had to be reintroduced into Wisconsin after loss of habitat and over trapping significantly dwindled their numbers.
