# **4-H Activities for at Home!**

### **Power of Plants-Decoding Plants**

Plants are multi-celled organisms with cell walls that often use the process of photosynthesis to make food for survival. In addition to providing oxygen to our planet, plants supply 90% of human calorie intake, 80% of human protein intake, and are critical to our wellbeing. We can thank plants for providing us with a healthy and sustainable food system.

In this activity, you'll learn about the taxonomy system which classifies and organizes plants all around us. You'll begin to understand how living organisms are related, and what makes them different.

#### **Activity Steps**

In this activity, you will use taxonomy to classify and organize different types of plants. It's important to know two things:

- Botany is the scientific study of plants along with their \* growth, structure, evolution, and uses. A botanist is a scien tist who studies plants.
- Taxonomy is the branch of science concerned with classifying liv \* ing organisms. Any living organism – bacteria, protist, fungi, plants, and animals – can be classified using taxonomy.



**Did you know?** Photosynthesis is the process where plants use sunlight to convert carbon dioxide and water into food to survive. During photo-

synthesis, the plant releases oxygen into the atmosphere. There are only a few plants that do not use photosynthesis to survive, and that's because they get their nutrients from other organisms (for example, a Venus Fly Trap plant eats small insects like flies).

Follow these instructions and enjoy this activity that makes it easy to learn more about how plants are classified:

- Print out the plant cards 1.
- Cut along the dotted lines to trim around each of the plant cards 2.
- Turn the cards upside down, and randomly mix them up. Choose your first card! 3.
- Print out the dichotomous key and use it to identify a specific type of plant on your chosen card. 4. The dichotomous key is a tool that can be used to identify organisms or objects. The key consists of a series of paired statements about features or characteristics. The answer to the question guides you to the next question.

**Did you know?** French scientist Jean Baptiste Lamarck developed the first text-based dichot omous key in 1778. Other scientists used his tools to determine the names of dif ferent plants found throughout France. The prefix "di" means two, which is why with each statement or question, a scientist is given two options.

Print out the answer chart, and record your answers in it as you go. You can check your answers at 5. the end of the activity.

Did you know? Dichotomous keys categorize organisms so botanists can compare new species with the information we already know. For example, if we know all angiosperms produce flowers and a new plant with flowers is discovered, then we can generally conclude this new plant will be an angiosperm. Or, we know that a monocot is known as a flowering plant with one seed leaf (or cotyledon), and similar plants would fall into the same grouping.

## **Fair Signs**

The fair is continuing to offer the *Fair Sign Program*.

This is how it works - We will pay any 4H Club or FFA Chapter \$25 for designing a new sign promoting the Pierce County Fair or \$10 for changing the dates on an existing sign or do both. Get permission to place your sign in a great spot and set it up!

### *Important Details:* The sign must be *four feet by eight feet* and include the following:

Pierce County Fair - August 11<sup>th</sup> thru August 14<sup>th</sup> – Ellsworth and your chapter/club name. Do not use any words detracting from the fair message.

Please use the following steps:

- 1. To place a 4'x 8' sign, obtain the land owner's permission.
- 2. Ensure the sign is placed on private land, not the road right of way (not in front of signs, corners/ edges of the road).
- 3. Signs need to be on display by July 17<sup>th</sup> and <u>re-</u> moved one week after the fair.
- 4. Email a color photo to Liz Dietsche at the Pierce County Fair Office – <u>liz.dietsche@co.pierce.wi.us</u> prior to the fair indicating locations and whether the sign is new/used/changed.
- 5. Reimbursement occurs when sign is removed and an email is sent to Liz Dietsche indicating the removal date. *The Highway Department requires sign removal less than 30 days after the Fair.*

#### **AVIAN INFLUENZA** PROTECT YOUR FLOCK

- · Sanitize equipment and clothing used around your birds
- · Protect your birds from contact with wild birds; and
- · Restrict access to your property and keep your birds away from other birds

#### Avian Influenza symptoms can include one or more of the following:

- Decreased food consumption, huddling, depression, closed eyes
- Respiratory signs, such as coughing and sneezing
- Decreased egg production, watery greenish diarrhea, excessive thirst
- Swollen wattles and combs

Currently, there is no imminent threat to humans in Wisconsin since there is little evidence of sustained human-to-human spread of the bird flu in other parts of the world. However, avian flu can have significant economic impacts, so we want residents to be aware.

Don't miss out on the opportunity to learn more about our world as the Spring Virtual Global Exploration Series continues its "trip" around the world with upcoming session focusing on Malaysia! This program is designed for youth of all ages and their families. UW-Madison International Students and Reach Program Ambassadors will be sharing information about their home country, different aspects of their culture, and language!!! So far, we have explored three different countries and cultures.

Our first stop in India was led by Sourabh. He spoke about India's long history from the Indus Valley civilization to becoming the world's largest democracy today! Sourabh also shared about the Holi Festival, also known as the Festival of Color, in which festival-goers are covered in a colored powder that is thrown in the air!

Next was a trip to China led by Cecilia. She told us about the more than fifty ethnic groups present throughout China- and how the food and language also vary depending on which part you are in. We learned basic greetings including 你好 (nǐ hǎo) which means hello, 谢谢 (xièxiè) which means thank you, and 再见 (zàijiàn) which means goodbye, but we learned that just saying "bye-bye" was more common for younger generations. We also had fun comparing and contracting food in Wisconsin and China!

Our third stop took us to Kazakhstan to meet Alan. We learned that horses were first domesticated in Kazakhstan and that the first satellite and man into space both launched from presentday Kazakhstan. He shared about the many beautiful places and landscapes that can be seen throughout the world's ninth biggest country. In return, participants shared some of their favorite places in Wisconsin that they recommended Alan visit during his remaining years at UW-Madison.
