#### New Market Beef Weigh-in Date: Sunday, March 6, 2022 from NOON-3pm

The weigh in will be held in the scale house at the Pierce County Fairgrounds. We will use the same process that was emailed out for the original weigh in date. We will also email a reminder out closer to the date with complete weigh-in information. Please email the livestock committee if you have questions.

- All market steers & heifers <u>MUST</u> be weighed at this weigh in to be shown at the fair! This is a requirement per the fairbook.
- Market feeders & breeding stock animals do not need to be weighed in.
- Please remember that animals should halter broke.
- Please have a halter on your animals when you bring them to the weigh in.

# Spring Weigh In for Goats, Sheep & Swine: April 16th 2022

The weigh in will be held in the scale house at the Pierce County Fairgrounds.

Sheep & Goats: 9-9:30am

Swine: 10am-Noon

All animals planning to be shown in a Market Class must be weighed in at the spring weight in. Please watch your emails for full details closer to the date.

#### **Livestock Judging:**

Livestock judging practices will be starting soon (usually the end of March). Any youth member enrolled in 4-H is able to participate. Members are not required to be in a livestock project to participate. There will be two age groups:

Junior: ages 8 ( & in at least the 3rd grade) to age 13 (as of January 1st)

Senior: ages 14-19 (as of January 1st).

Practices will consist of both in the classroom and on the farm type practices where they will be able to view live animals. Both teams will participate in the Area Animals Science Day in mid-June. #### **YQCA & Rules Meetings**

All livestock exhibitors planning to show beef, goats, sheep or swine at the 2022 Pierce County Fair are required to attend a rules meeting <u>AND</u> complete the annual YQCA training. There are two remaining dates available to attend a Rules meeting. Parents are not required but strongly encouraged to attend the rules meetings as well.

There are also only two more remaining opportunities to take the YQCA (Youth for Quality Care of Animals) training in person. However, it may also be completed online at yqca.org. Once you have completed the YQCA training, you may send an electronic copy of your certificate to the livestock committee at: piercecountylivestockcommittee@gmail.com.

\* If you are required to take the YQCA for another species such as dairy, you only need to take it one time per year. You do not have to take it multiple times for multiple project areas.

- ❖ For a 4-H or Scout member—advance entry is \$18.00 per cat with proof of affiliation.
- \* Registrations at the door will be accepted with an entry fee of \$30.00 per cat.
- \* A program listing registered cats will be created with exhibitor information for attendees.
- \* Minimum age for kittens is 4 months. Pregnant cats may NOT be shown

This is a vetted show. Each cat will be checked and must receive approval before it is allowed in the show hall. Proof of Rabies and Distemper shots are required at time of check-in. All cats must have their claws clipped or they will be clipped before benching for a small fee. Judges are looking for an all-over clean, healthy cat. We ask that you bathe your cat just before the show. Their ears and eyes should be clean and their coats be groomed so they are mat-free and untangled. Show management will remove any feline that shows signs of contagious illness or disease. If your cat does not pass vet-in, we cannot refund your fees. A fee of \$35 for any returned checks.

<u>Cages</u> will be provided. Cage size is 22"x 22" x 45". Bring something to cover the top and sides of the cage. Sheets, blankets, and beach towels work well. Bring your own litter pan, cat food and water dish. Litter will be provided.

Two judges will present awards during the judging. Rosettes will be awarded to all registered cats. At the start of the show each judge will pick one of the two classes to judge and then switch classes later so your cats are judged by two different judges.

Lists of food delivery options will be available. You can bring in your own food but no alcohol is allowed. Bottled water with flavor packets will be available for sale. Club will also have a raffle table and items for sale.

**Liability:** Neither Fox River Valley Cat Club nor Winnegamie Dog club will assume responsibility for any damage or injury to any person, animal, or property. We reserve the right to refuse any entry or ask for removal of any cat from the Show Hall in the best interest of the exhibitors. The show hall is rubberized matting. Any damage to the floor or building caused by an exhibitor or parties with an exhibitor (such as children or guests), that exhibitor will be held liable for any damage.
