

We want our environments to be as safe as possible for our youth, but we also acknowledge 4-H needs to do lot of a trial... and error... and FUN. If you have questions or concerns on how to adhere to these policies, April is always willing to chat with you about it and get you the information and the resources you need.

This Month We Will Look At: Roadside Clean-Up and Parades

Roadside Clean-Up:

Regardless of the road (including state highways, county highways, streets, etc.) 4-H Clubs and Groups must follow the Wisconsin Department of Transportation rules/quidelines, youth volunteers must be at least 11 years of age or in the 6th grade, to participate in roadside clean-ups. Please note that counties or local municipalities may set stricter rules that must be followed. 4-H Clubs and Groups should consider alternative lower risk community service clean-up projects like parks, hiking trails, etc.

Parades:

Wisconsin 4-H is committed to providing safe and healthy environments for youth and adults participating in 4-H programs and activities. Preparing floats and participating in parades can be a fun way to promote 4-H, AND there are risks associated with these activities. Did You Know that Youth in Agriculture Can Get a Loan?

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farm Service Agency (FSA) makes operating loans of up to \$5,000 to eligible individual youths ages 10 to 20 to finance income-producing, agriculture-related projects. The project must be of modest size, educational, and initiated, developed, and carried out by youths participating in 4-H clubs, FFA, tribal youth organizations, or similar agricultural-affiliated groups.

<u> MPORTANT! Please READ!!! Program Changes</u>

Due to changes in Pierce County Fair Insurance Policy, any events that take place off of the fairgrounds will no longer be eligible for a fair premium. This includes the powder burning events, which are Shotgun, Muzzleloader, .22 Rifle & .22 Pistol.

What does this mean for the Shooting Sports fair competition in 2023? It means there will be NO change for Archery, Air Pistol & Air Rifle target competition, and we will be moving the Air Rifle silhouette competition to the fairgrounds. You will sign up for these events like usual through the fair & participants will still receive premiums for these events.

As far as the powder-burning competition events, we will still hold all of those events at the River Falls Sportsmen's Club as usual, but the sign up will be different and you will not receive premiums for the powder- burning events. All the targets will still receive ribbons & be hung in the Round Barn. 4-H members will still need to meet the practice requirements to be eligible to shoot these events for our competition. Fair Exhibit Tags

ALL Fair tags (Jr. Fair and Open) will be available for pick up at the FAIR OFFICE in the Seyforth Building ON THE FAIRGROUNDS during the following hours:

• Starting Friday, July 21st – Friday, August 4th – 10am – 4pm. We will NOT have availability on FRIDAY, July 28th due to concert preparation.

Extra Hours for Pick-up:

- Saturday August 5th 7:30am 12pm
- Sunday August 6th 8:30am 10:30am
- Monday, August 7th 8:30am 6pm
- Tuesday, August 8th 8:30am 8pm

Make a plan to pick up your exhibit tags. Check with club leaders as some do pick up entire club tags to have available at upcoming meetings. Exhibit tags and passes will be in the same envelope. - If there is a fair administration error, you will receive a PINK Correction Form and receive full premium.
- If you, the exhibitor, change classes, but the entry tag matches your entry form, you will receive a BLUE Correction Form. You can show for the correct ribbon, but will receive a pink premium and not be in consideration for Champion.

Each exhibit must have a tag. Be sure to follow instructions in the Premium Book in displaying your tag. Superintendents and helpers are available only in the timelines indicated in the Premium Book on pages 2-5.

Lost/Destroyed Junior Fair or Season Tickets

Visitors and exhibitors are required to show their admission tickets each time of entrance. Transfer or loan of tickets will be considered fraud and will subject the offender to a fine of \$25. A lost ticket will not be replaced without purchase. Unused tickets will not be refunded.

Booth Decorations

4-H CLUB Booth decorations can be put up on Monday, August 7th & Tuesday, August 8th from 8 am - 6:00 p.m. booths are being judged Wednesday. Decorations can be taken down after 4:30 pm on Sunday. Nothing is guarded until Wednesday. Booths for Self Determined can be set up Monday until 6 pm & Tuesday until 1:00 pm judging time.

Barn Permits

Junior Exhibitors who have animals & are Grade 6 or older, overnight permits obtained from the Fair Office by 8:00 pm each evening. Exhibitors may stay only in barn where their animal is housed. Separate permits needed for each night, & can be issued at the same time. Junior exhibitor's parents or legal guardian must sign regardless of the exhibitor's age. Any unruly conduct such as use of cigarettes, cigars, pipes, illegal drugs, alcohol, abusive language, violent tempers, or intimate physical relations is not allowed. Youth have a midnight curfew. Disciplinary action for failure to comply with the permit procedure, conduct rule or curfew will result in immediate removal from the Fairgrounds, revoking of further overnight privileges & loss of animal premiums.

Removal of Exhibits REMINDER

<u>FAIR EXHIBITS MAY NOT BE REMOVED BEFORE 4:30 p.m. ON SUNDAY, OR PREMIUMS WILL BE FORFEITED.</u> Also, remember you MUST pick up your projects on Sunday between 4:30 and 6:30. Do not leave them at the fair. They will be unsupervised & tossed after the fair.

Face to Face Judging at a Glance (Exhibitor must be present)

This is a 2-way conversation between the member and the judge. The judge will ask questions about your project, what you've learned, what was the most challenging part, etc. Also, you may ask the judge questions that you may have. The object is for you to learn from your exhibit. Together, you'll discuss your work; don't be afraid of the judge. Judges are there to help you learn and grow.

As you work on your project activities and prepare exhibits for the fair, remember to prepare yourself, too. Conference judging includes an evaluation of both your actual exhibit, and you're learning and knowledge of the exhibit. You should prepare for both parts of the evaluation. Think about what you learned in preparing your exhibit, the decisions you made, why you made them, and the quality of your finished exhibit. Knowing and doing the following should help you out:

- 1. Prepare your exhibit carefully and neatly.
- 2. Know why you chose this item as your exhibit and how it fits your project.
- 3. Know how you prepared your exhibit.
- 4. Know how much the exhibit cost in time, materials, and effort.
- 5. Be able to explain what decisions you made, and why, in preparing the exhibit.
- 6. Study some background information about the exhibit topic.
- 7. Be able to explain some of the problems you had making this exhibit & what you might do differently if you did it again.
- 8. Decide if the results were worth the costs and what you learned.
- 9. Know what other kinds of exhibits/projects you might be interested in doing in the project area.
- 10. Don't chew gum during the conference.
- 11. Look at the judge.
- 12. Be confident.
- 13. Relax


