

We anticipate a 7-10 day waiting period for cards to become available at which time they will be organized by club, and available for pick up at the UW Extension Office.

We want our environments to be as safe as possible for our youth, but we also acknowledge 4-H needs to do lot of a trial... and error... and FUN. If you have questions or concerns about how to adhere to these policies, April is always willing to chat with you about it and get you the information & resources you need.

This Month We Will Look At: 4-H Volunteers- Enrollment Process

Anyone at least 18 years old by September 1 can apply to become WI 4-H volunteer as long as they are not a high school student.

Individuals cannot be enrolled as both a WI 4-H member & a WI 4-H volunteer. Once accepted as a WI 4-H volunteer, the individual is no longer eligible to be a WI 4-H member.

All 4-H programs & activities must be supervised by a staff member or an approved 4-H volunteer, 18 years of age or older, who has completed all the following steps:

Step 1: Enroll in 4-H Online including agreeing to the <u>Division of Extension Volunteer Behavior Expectations</u>. Step 2: Complete Criminal Background Check\* (info will be sent via email to all new potential volunteers once enrolled)

Step 3: Complete Volunteer Training Modules:

Step 4: Do you read the Informant? Be the first person to call April at the Extension Office (phone # on the first page) to win a prize. Shari Turvaville won a cool Pierce County T-shirt last month.

o Module 1: Complete UW Madison Title IX Training

Module 2: Complete UW System Mandated Reporter Training

Module 3: Complete Division of Extension Volunteers In Preparation (VIP) Training\*\*

Module 4 (for chaperones only): Volunteers serving as a chaperone will need to also complete the Supporting Youth Mental Health Training

\*A background records check for arrest &conviction records will be completed every 4 years for continuing 4-H volunteer leaders.

\*\*Returning volunteers who have been absent for 1-4 years need a background records check, signed Volunteer Behavior Expectations form, & Assumption of Risk but are not required to attend the orientation to be reinstated as a volunteer. Returning volunteers who have been absent for over 4 years need to repeat the Youth Protection process. For more information on Wisconsin 4-H Volunteer Policies, please visit




