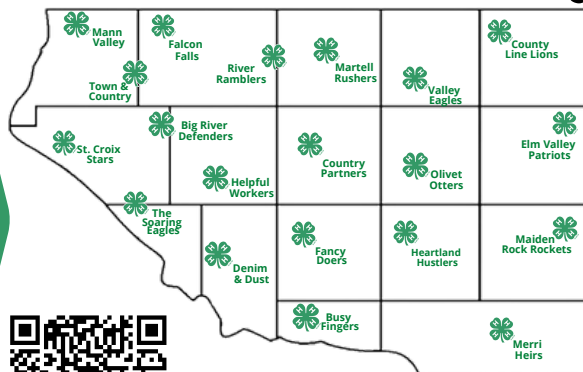

- Largest global youth organization with nearly 6 million American youths involved.
- 4-H empowers young individuals through youth development.
- 4-H provides leadership opportunities and develops youth into confident, hard-working, determined, responsible, and compassionate young people.

## Is 4-H For Me?

- YES! Anyone can be in 4-H!
- Open to youth 5 - 19 years of age.
- Adults can participate as volunteers supporting the youth.
- 4-H does not have specific membership requirements and costs are minimal.

## How Can You Get Involved?

- 4-H members engage in hands-on learning in project areas. Such as science, arts, animals, and more. This allows youth to choose projects based on their family's budget.
